If we are going to be happy, we are going to have to learn from God how to be happy (Psalm 143:10). God teaches through His word that, if we are going to be happy, we have to learn to appreciate every day (Psalm 118:24), we have to trust Him with all of our heart (Proverbs 16:20) and we have to relish the Scriptures (Psalm 19:8). But it is not enough to learn how to be happy, we must also understand the foundation for true happiness. Consider this truth in Psalms 11:3, "If the foundations be destroyed, what can the righteous do?" If the foundation of happiness is destroyed, there will be no happiness. Physically speaking, the foundation is of great importance in anything you desire to build. This principle is even more significant spiritually speaking (Matthew 7:24-27). Happiness is founded upon God's presence. Happiness is not founded upon our earthly accomplishments (Ecclesiastes 1:14); it is ultimately measured by our relationship with God.






JACK THOMASON is recovering from knee replacement surgery. DELMER WILSON'S biopsy proved negative.

"Bring Glory To His Name"

"Emmanuel" means "God with us." Based on the promise of Hebrews 13:5, "I will never leave thee nor forsake thee," we can say, "God is with us." The language of Matthew 1:21, which quotes from Isaiah 7:14 in the Old Testament. has a much stronger meaning. The language means that "this child born to Mary is God." This harmonizes with the statement of I Timothy 3:16, "God was manifest in the flesh..." Jesus, the Son, is also identified as God in Hebrews 1:8. "But unto the Son he saith, Thy throne, O God, is for ever and ever: a sceptre of righteousness is the sceptre of thy kingdom." We can say based on plain Bible statements, "Jesus is God with us." The title "Lord" means "Master," the one in command over us. The Philippian jailer asked, "Sirs, what must I do to be saved?" Paul's answer included the titles "Lord," "Christ," and the name "Jesus." "Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ, and thou shalt be saved, and thy house" (Acts 16:30-31). "Neither is there salvation in any other: for there is none other name under heaven given among men, whereby we must be saved" (Acts 4:12). Jesus our Savior has the right family history, He was born at just the right time, in the right town, and he has the right name for his character and mission. He is worthy of our love and praise. Let us honor His name.
