**“Health, Wealth or The Gospel Of
Jesus Christ”**

Multitudes in the denominational world are willing to preach a message of health, wealth and popularity. Paul predicted this would be the case, speaking lies in hypocrisy, having their own conscience seared with a hot iron, (1 Timothy 4:2) For the time will come when they will not endure sound doctrine, but according to their own desires, because they have itching ears, they will heap to themselves teachers; and they will turn their ears away from the truth, and be turned aside to fables. (2 Timothy 4:3-4) Faithful preachers must not shrink back because they are in a minority. Those who speak the truth are few in number, but numbers don't matter to God. Faithfulness does. There are many temptations unique to preachers. One is the temptation to preach an easy message, or refrain from preaching a hard message, in order to secure his livelihood. When a preacher is supported by the free-will offerings of those to whom he preaches there always resides danger of preaching to please. To preach a hard message that convicts God's people of sin and wrongdoing may cost him his job. He must declare God's Truth unashamedly and without reservation nonetheless. Those who preach the truth will often be hated by some, perhaps many (1 Kings 22:7-8). Our Lord said as much Himself. Woe to you when all men speak well of you, For so did their fathers to the false prophets. (Luke 6:26) Paul repeated this truth. Yes, and all who desire to live godly in Christ Jesus will suffer persecution. (2 Timothy 3:12) We must always keep in mind that ease and comfort in the here and now is not our goal. An eternal home in heaven with God is that for which we strive. I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith. Finally, there is laid up for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous Judge, will give to me on that Day, and not to me only but also to all who have loved His appearing. (2 Timothy 4:7-8) That is why I preach the truth and encourage others to do the same.
