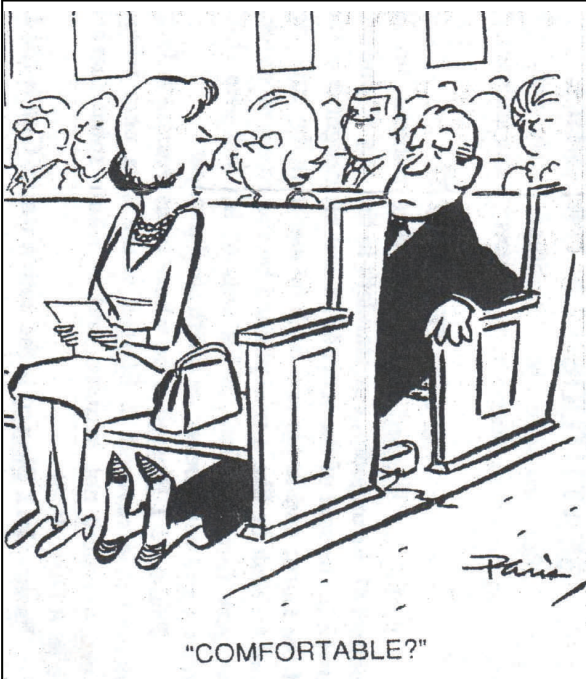


Teen News

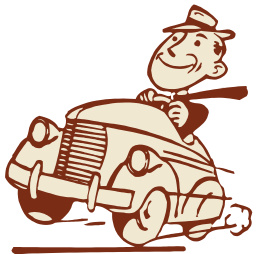

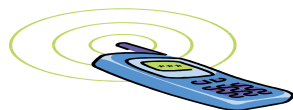
MONDAY NIGHT FOR THE MASTER BEGINS AGAIN
