DID YOU KNOW ANNIE?

This lady lived in Palestine years ago and went to church at Queen & DeBard before they merged with Crockett Road. This article was written by the preacher from that church and Billie Bedford brought it to us as an inspiration to us all.

AN EXAMPLE OF FAITH

I knew a fine lady about fifty years ago that still stands out in my mind as one of the greatest examples of how Christians face adversity that I have ever known. I was preaching for the DeBard Street church in Palestine, TX in the late 1950's where I met Sister Annie Lou Day. But, what made her so different than most other people? Annie had a son, Billy, when she was in her early twenties. Billy was born with a mental problem, but was able to remain at home. About this time Annie developed a severe case of arthritis and became bedfast. Her husband left her and she was faced with supporting herself and Billy from her bed. She lived in a small

apartment over a store (she owned the building) and had some income from the rental. She also used the telephone to sell magazines and other items that could be sold over the phone. When Billy became older, he fixed a tray that hung around his neck loaded with pencils, shoestrings, etc. and walked the streets selling them. Together they survived. Annie was a faithful Christian. Though bedfast, she seldom missed a service. She built a hand operated elevator so she could be lowered to the ground in a wheelchair. She also taught the principals of serving the Lord to Billy. One day when I was visiting, Billy came in from selling his wares. He sat down and began counting his money. He would place some of them in a pile and place the others in a jar. The jar was his contribution jar. Annie said he put the money in every time he came home so it would be ready each Sunday. He was afraid he would spend it all and not have it ready for the contribution on the Lord's Day. Annie Lou did not think of herself as handicapped, she simply had a few more obstacles to overcome than most people. When I begin to feel discouraged, I think of Annie Lou and realize how richly I have been blessed. She departed this life, but I am confident she has a home of peace and rest awaiting her in eternity. How much better this world would be if there were more Annie Lou Days.
